

# Israel and Jewish Evangelism Today

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## Study Questions

1. Can you describe an opportunity you had sharing the Gospel with a Jewish person? What questions did they ask and how did you respond? What objections did you find hard to answer, and upon reflection how would you have responded differently?
2. What is your understanding of Romans 1:16, and how does this passage impact the Jewish evangelism today? What is your view on what Paul meant by “to the Jew first”?
3. Does your church have any type of involvement in Jewish missions—if so, can you describe?
4. In your own words, describe what Dr. Glaser meant by the eschatological motivation for Jewish missions. Do you have any thoughts about this idea?
5. What, in your opinion, is the reason why God chose the Jewish people. What is the purpose of the nation and how do you see this purpose fulfilled historically, today and in the future?
6. Does the Abrahamic covenant include the promise of the Land of Israel? Can you reflect for a moment on this promise in light of the current political climate in Israel?
7. In your own words, please summarize the importance of the key passages cited in the chapter: Matthew 23:37-39, Acts 3:19-21, Zechariah 12:10 and Romans 11:25-29?
8. What do you think about this line of reasoning and how should this impact your own personal ministry to Jewish people and that of your local congregation?
9. What other passages of Scripture in either the Old or New Testaments do you find important passages that might motivate a disciple of Jesus to share the Good News with Jewish people?
10. What acts of kindness do you think you and your church or congregation might initiate on behalf of the state of Israel, your local Jewish community, or for Jewish people you know and love that might open hearts for the Gospel?
